

Relationships can be fun, exciting, puzzling and painful. Everyone is different and relationships develop overtime. It's also okay not to be in a relationship.

It's normal to be curious, excited or even put off about the possibilities of sex. It is important that you take your time and don't do anything that you are uncomfortable with, that is against

the law, or the wishes of another person.

You are breaking the law if you have sex before the age of 16.

## If you don't feel ready - **Always say NO!** Don't be put under pressure.

If you have unprotected sex you risk getting pregnant or getting a sexually transmitted infection (STI). Using a condom can protect you from an unwanted pregnancy and STI's such as Chlamydia, genital herpes, genital warts, gonorrhoea, HIV and syphilis. Some STI's have no symptoms and if

you don't know you are infected and don't get treatment you could develop serious long-term health problems

If you are over 16 and haven't had sex, chances are most of your friends haven't either - whatever they say.
Only you will know when you are ready.

If you're thinking about having sex or think you might be at risk from infections you should speak to someone you trust, your doctor or contact a specialist agency to get tested. There are also a number of agencies that provide free information and confidential advice.
