A natural part of growing up is exploring your sexual identity and which sex (boys or girls) you feel most attracted to. It's quite normal to think sexually about both sexes while exploring your own sexuality. Some people

feel sure about their sexual identity, while others may not be so sure. It may take time to figure out and make sense of who you are.

Everyone has a sexual identity. Don't let opinions stop you from being yourself.

Bisexual (bi) means you are attracted to both sexes

Heterosexual (straight) means you are attracted to the opposite sex

Homosexual (gay/lesbian) means you are attracted to the same sex

Transgender means you may feel you have been born into the wrong body - you may have been born into a male body but feel more like a woman or the other way around - Transgender people may feel they are either bisexual, heterosexual or homosexual (gay/lesbian).

You have every right to be comfortable with who you are but it can be difficult to talk to others about your feelings and sexuality. If you feel you cannot speak to a parent. You should speak to a doctor or school counsellor.
